The Slow Food movement was born out of a response to society's increasingly fast-paced lifestyle. In the 1980s, McDonald's planned to open a restaurant near the Spanish Steps, a historic landmark in Rome. Carlo Petrini was annoyed that a fast-food restaurant was opening in Italy, so he started Slow Food International, a group in which people slow down and enjoy the food they make and eat. One of its goals is to encourage people to eat local foods. Foods from nearby locations are fresher and healthier than those that come from faraway places. If possible, it's even better to eat organic foods and foods that are closest to their natural states.

Slow Food International also believes that people who produce food should be paid fairly. These ideas are supported by people around the world. The group has more than 100,000 members in 132 countries. They promote the group's beliefs by organizing local farmers' markets, workshops, and sometimes wine tasting events. Some members even established the University of Gastronomic Sciences in 2003 to help maintain an organic relationship between eating agriculture. According to Slow Food followers, people don't have to completely give up fast food. People should just be aware of where their food comes from so that they can be responsible eaters.
