

Developed with human feedback, ChatGPT can create coherent responses to almost any question, but some responses can contain incorrect information. The reason for this is that ChatGPT prioritizes producing strings of text that read like something written by a human, sometimes at the expense of accuracy. Unlike most other chatbots, ChatGPT can assist users with writing essays, analyzing text, and finding errors in computer code. Currently, ChatGPT is still a work in progress.
