


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For question 1, please look at the four pictures.





History about MBTI

1. The initial version of the MBTI was developed during the Second World War by a mother-daughter duo.
2. They aimed to help women identify suitable jobs.

W: Hey, Patrick. What are you doing right now? (9/26-27)

M: Hi, Maggie. I'm taking an online personality test. It's called the MBTI.

W: I think that acronym stands for the *Myers-Briggs Type Indicator*. It's a personality test that is divided into four categories, right?

M: Correct. The four categories are introversion/extraversion, sensing/intuition, thinking/feeling, and judging/perceiving. Everyone has a dominant quality from each category. All the combinations of these traits will result in 16 different personality types.

W: I see. What personality type are you?

M: I'm an ESTP person, which is totally opposite to my brother.

W: Wow, I wouldn't have guessed your brother is like that. Can you tell me more about this test?

M: Sure. As I know, the first version of the MBTI was created during World War II by a mother-daughter duo. Their aim was to help women identify suitable jobs that matched their personality preferences since many women were entering the workforce during the war.
